- New Jersey Comfort Partners program- sponsor by NJ's electric and gas companies to help tenants and homeowners to save energy and money by making your home more energy efficient.
 - Eligibility;
 - Must be a NJ resident at or below the 225% of the federal poverty guidelines
 - Home energy assistance program (HEAP)
 - o Lifeline
 - Pharmaceutical assistance to the Aged and Disabled (PAAD)
 - Section 8 Housing
 - Federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF)
 - Universal Service Fund (USF)
