LOCAL ARTIST DISPLAYS THE POWERFUL ART OF MURALS

PARTNER and the City of Perth Amboy Department of Recreation collaborate to host opening reception on city's public art initiative

PERTH AMBOY - March 9, 2017- The Perth Amboy Redevelopment Team for Neighborhood Enterprise and Revitalization (P.A.R.T.N.E.R.) and the City of Perth Amboy take the lead in revitalizing the arts under the Gateway Neighborhood Collaborative (GNC) initiative through the promotion and exhibit of a mural art opening at the Gallery Center for the Arts located on 339 Reade Street. The art reception "On Tour Series with Albertus Joseph," is about a local artist that uses paint on canvas, boards, and walls to create his graphic novel style inspired works. Joseph calls himself "a sculptor that paints"... while being both a sculptor and a painter, most of his resent works have been paintings. His work varies from loose bold brush strokes with primary colors used in a layering effect to a tighter and highly detailed works all while utilizing a "from the tube" coloring process. His work seen from New York to the Netherlands, depicts the strengths of the people and beauty in the expressions and gestures of the "talent" he paints.

"Everything that I have done and everything that I am, I put into my work. I wave no flags and boast no accolades that has brought me to where I am today as a person or an artist," said Albertus Joseph. "Formally trained but all the work is owed to some romantic ideology that I cling to with an iron grip. My mother was my first inspiration and my father was a backbone of support. An unquenchable love of life and my surroundings stems from my acceptance of what is and a need to be worthy of such remarkable and beautiful."

P.A.R.T.N.E.R., a Wells Fargo Regional Foundation 2015 neighborhood revitalization grantee of the GNC initiative, aim to explore the strength of the Gateway Neighborhood's cultural diversity as a way to leverage arts and culture not only as an economic engine but also as a way to bring to the neighborhood together into three overarching goals which will provide appropriate measurement indicators.

- (1) Enhance Community Organization (Neighborhood Building
- (2) Promote New Mix of Retail, Residential and other Land Uses
- (3) Encourage the Expansion and Integration of Neighborhood Assets, Facilities, and Services.

The strategy uses a community-based approach to neighborhood restoration to enhance the viability and quality of life for its residents. The five-year initiative will work with the City of Perth Amboy and other GNC partners on several beautification projects that include a community garden and eight (8) community murals in the neighborhood. "By creating sustainable opportunities for art and cultural venues to celebrate the diversity of the Gateway Neighborhood in Perth Amboy, we look to increase the mix of retail, entertainment, to define and

attract new businesses, and act as anchors for investment, employment, and revitalization," said Douglas Dzema, Executive Director of P.A.R.T.N.E.R. The subject area is an estimated 42 square blocks located within the southeastern and central quadrants of the City of Perth Amboy.

"My overarching goal as Mayor of this City is to bring unity and improve quality of life. Art has a way of achieving that goal. Murals allow for public expression, involvement and mobilizes creativity for all ages that speaks for the entire community. By the same token, we see the benefits reflected in our local economy, vt beautifying our business area and expanding arts and culture," said Wilda Diaz, Mayor of the City of Perth Amboy.
